The purpose of the *Hispanic Anabaptist Biblical Seminary* (SeBAH) is to provide theological Biblical education and practical training. The methodology of education is designed to train people who are in active Christian ministry, intend to start a ministry, as well as leaders who have the desire to acquire Biblical and theological knowledge.

SeBAH students will learn pastoral skills from professors who incorporate their ministry and pastoral life experience into the courses, from the Biblical perspective of the Anabaptist Radical Reformation.

Our curriculum or study program approaches the Biblical narrative by applying critical thinking in the following areas: Bible as the word of God, pastoral ministry, Christian formation, Biblical theology, pastoral counseling and church history.

SeBAH has an open enrollment system. New students can join the classes in any trimester of the year. New online classes start every three months.

Online Learning

The *Hispanic Anabaptist Biblical Seminary* has always maintained the commitment that its academic program is achievable. SeBAH offers the courses using the MOODLE platform, an interactive website with features and activities that involve and engage the student in a collaborative learning process. Each student will receive his or her own course page with a personalized password. After entering their own course page using a personalized password, they will find the course offered in that trimester. The participants receive technical support.

Class to Acquire Skill of Online Study

The *Thought and Reflection to the Paper* class is offered at the beginning of the program to help students acquire online study skills. Education in virtual learning (online) environments requires knowing how to use and manage the online tools to write various documents according to academic requirements. The course of *Thought and Reflection to the Paper* is designed to obtain online study experience. The aim is to help seminary students develop the indispensable skills necessary in the preparation of writings that include reflective and analytical thinking. Such skills will guide them in developing original written works, according to the requirements of the academy at the university level.
