OVERVIEW OF ENROLLMENT REPORTS

Enrollment numbers are one of many ways to look at our Mennonite educational institutions and programs. It is the intent of this report to offer a glimpse into Mennonite education by focusing on one area: enrollment. For those who are interested in more in-depth analysis or more information on a specific area, please contact the MEA office at info@mennoniteeducation.org.

MEA has gathered enrollment statistics from the various education levels and educational programs for many years. Enrollment statistics at the PreK-12 level include only the member schools of Mennonite Schools Council (MSC). Please note that two international schools are affiliated members of MSC— Colegio Americas Unidas in Colombia and Lezha Academic Center in Albania. Other Mennonite PreK-12 schools and early childhood education centers scattered across North America that are not MSC members are not included in these reports. Preschool enrollment data was collected from Mennonite Early Childhood Network members for the seventh time this year.

The enrollment data is presented using the following levels and/or categories:

Preschool programs of Mennonite Early Childhood Network (MECN)

Prekindergarten, elementary, middle, and secondary programs of Mennonite Schools Council (MSC) schools

Undergraduate programs of Bethel College, Bluffton University, Eastern Mennonite University (EMU), Goshen College and Hesston College

Adult degree-completion programs of Bluffton University, EMU and Goshen College

Graduate programs of Bluffton University, EMU and Goshen College

Seminary programs of Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary (AMBS) and Eastern Mennonite Seminary (EMS)

Other degree program of Seminario Bíblico Anabautista Hispano (SeBAH)

Non-degree program of Instituto Bíblico Anabautista (IBA)

Under each level are current year statistics and basic enrollment trend charts or tables. We have chosen to further break down the enrollment data by focusing on Mennonite enrollment data (both Mennonite Church USA and other Mennonite groups) and Racial/Ethnic enrollment data (including both U.S. Racial/Ethnic and international students).

As you look at the numbers and reach your own conclusions, here are some helpful definitions:

Full-time – students taking the number of credit hours required by the institution to receive full-time status

Part-time - students taking fewer credit hours than the minimum needed for full-time status

FTE – full-time equivalent (adding the credit hours of both full-time and part-time students to determine the possible number of full-time students)

Head count - total number of students regardless of their part-time or full-time status

Racial/Ethnic – refers to students from under-represented Racial/Ethnic groups from the United States; in the higher education institutions the Racial/Ethnic count refers only to Racial/Ethnic students from the U.S., international students are a separate category

International - students at U.S. schools from countries other than the United States, and students at Canadian schools from countries other than Canada

A significant effort was made to ensure that our enrollment reports have integrity and that the findings accurately reflect the numbers. The enrollment numbers of an entire educational system can bury implications deep below the obvious surface interpretations. Care needs to be taken that assumptions are not made using only one small part of the data without putting such data elements into the context of the larger system. In an educational system as small as MEA's, a few unique circumstances can skew the findings of an entire segment of the report. These unique situations have been identified when possible throughout the report and have been taken into consideration in our analysis of the information. Tension between system wide trends and local realities is acknowledged. It is also important to note that these numbers are a picture of what enrollment looks like on a *particular* day at a *particular* institution.

The transformation that birthed MEA and merged multiple educational systems also disrupted the longstanding data collection procedures. The most reliable and consistent data enables eight-year to 14-year trend reports. Enrollment numbers from one year provide a very short insight into enrollment patterns, but they are not very helpful for long-range planning. Whenever possible, longer trends are provided. Great care has gone into the accuracy of the numbers reported.

The interpretation of the numbers can be viewed from several perspectives—usually shaped by the question or the person reading the data. For the purpose of this report, the focus was determined by the MEA outcome statement focused on "ready and viable access" as stated below:

Viable Access. Students seeking Christ-centered Anabaptist-Mennonite education have viable access to Mennonite Church USA schools.

Working with the schools on issues related to location, delivery system, cost, transfer and outreach to the under-served, MEA envisions and supports programs and initiatives that facilitate ready accessibility.

TOTAL SYSTEM HIGHLIGHTS

Current Year Systemwide Enrollment

Mennonite educational institutions are touching the lives of 9,350 students (based on headcount) in fall 2020, an increase of 168 (1.8%) students from the 2019 total of 9,182. In higher education, the total headcount increased by 35 students (with decreases of 73 in adult degree-completion and 42 in undergraduate and increases of 120 in graduate and 30 in seminary). Preschool, elementary, and secondary education levels showed an increase of 195 (3.8%). All higher education institutions reported their enrollment numbers. For the academic year 2020-2021, there are 24 MSC schools (22-member schools and two affiliates), and MEA received data from 21 of them. For the previous academic year, data was received from 19 MSC schools.


Headcount information from Mennonite Early Childhood Network (MECN) preschool/childcare centers (non-MSC schools) is included for the tenth year. For the academic year 2020-2021 MEA received data from three preschool/childcare centers that was not part of an MSC school. The data varies from year to year depending on which preschool centers report information.


Current Year Systemwide Mennonite Enrollment


"Mennonite Church USA" students include only those that report attending a Mennonite Church USA congregation. All other Mennonites are included in the "All Mennonite" category. Note that the number of Mennonite Church USA students in higher education in fall 2020 (496) decreased from the 2019 total (535) for a combined decrease of 39 while PreK-12 increased 132 for a total net increase of 93 in fall 2020.




Multi-year Mennonite Full-time Students as Percentage of Total Enrollment, 2015-2020


In 2020, Mennonite Church USA students comprise 17.9% of the total full-time enrollment at all levels, and full-time all Mennonites account for 24.0% of the total full-time enrollment. The systemwide full-time Mennonite Church USA and other Mennonite student enrollment increased 602 students (24.2%) from 1,887 in Fall 2019 to 2,020 in Fall 2020. Full-time enrollment data from Fall 2015 to 2020 are included for comparative purposes. The Mennonite student population for the total enrollment breaks out as follows:



You may note that the total number of all Mennonites attending higher education institutions decreased from 1,028 to 626 (39.1%) from 2015 to 2020. All areas of higher education experienced a decrease (Undergraduate from 897 to 581—35.2%, Adult degree-completion from 24 to 1—95.8%, Graduate from 61 to 12—80.3%, and Seminary from 46 to 32—30.4%) during the same time period. In this section, the PreK numbers from MECN institutions or programs that are not part of MSC schools are not included because the number of Mennonite/non-Mennonite students is not available.







PRESCHOOL PROGRAMS Mennonite Early Childhood Network

The Mennonite Early Childhood Network (MECN) was established in 2005 to address the care and education of children, birth through kindergarten, in through-the-week programs. The mission of MECN, is to assist in developing the whole child spiritually, physically, emotionally, socially and cognitively with a framework that reflects an Anabaptist interpretation* of the Christian faith by providing information and resources for parents and early educators of all children, birth through kindergarten. (*Christ is the center of our faith, Community is the center of our life, Reconciliation is the center of our work)

MECN provides resources for nurturing young children, including the website *Building Faith* at http://buildingfaithmecn.weebly.com/ written by Mennonite parents of young children to provide Anabaptist-based resources for those who raise and teach young children. The MECN website includes resources for early childhood education (www.MennoniteEducation.org), encourages networking opportunities among its members, and represents Mennonite early childhood education at Mennonite conferences.

MECN Survey Results - Fall 2020

Nine early childhood programs responded to the Mennonite Early Childhood data survey. Six of these are Mennonite Schools Council members. Three are independent centers housed in a Mennonite churches.

The programs represented were:

- preschool as part of a school program
- preschool (separate from a school program)

Five schools reported having a state license plus regional accreditation or participation in a quality rating system like the STARS rating, accreditation by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), or accreditation by a regional body. Two of the six MSC schools have MEA accreditation.

Mennonite early childhood centers serve a diverse mix of families. This includes Mennonite and related Anabaptist families, families from other denominations, and families with no faith affiliation. The reporting early childhood centers reported that they serve 20% Mennonite families, 80% other-than-Mennonite, and 18% ethnic diversity but are 82% Caucasian. Centers reported having 7% children with exceptionalities/special needs.

The early childhood centers represented in this report were started out of parent, family, community, church and school initiatives in each decade since the 1970s.

Program highlights that were shared include the following:

- Academia Menonita Betania in Aibonito PR
 - One of our achievement of the past year was maintain the total amount of students for the school year.
 - The other most important was to offer the service online since March 15, 2020, date when the government began the restrictions in Puerto Rico due to Covid-19 pandemic.
- Dock Mennonite Academy in Souderton PA
 - Outdoor play days are built into curriculum and the class goes outside rain/shine to learn together on our nature trail and other areas on the grounds. Mud, rain, snow and cold can be great learning environments when used strategical
 - Our teachers adapted well to the online format beginning in March, even for EC students. Many families appreciated the simple lessons and activities that were provided. The teachers surveyed parents at the end of the year and valuable data was gathered for use as we reopened with COVID restrictions this fall.
- Eighth Street Preschool in Goshen IN
 - We are working on updating our logo.
 - We applied for several grants and were well on our way to receiving them.
- Growing Tree Preschool in Chambersburg PA
 - My staff and I did a a great job with virtual learning last Spring. Yes, we had some students withdraw; however, it was only about 10%. I had expected to lose more. While we do not wish to return to virtual learning, we had many compliments that we handled things better than the school districts around us.
 - •We were able to open "in person" this fall after creating a Healthy and Safety Plan and a Re-Opening Plan. Many programs in our area did not. It has been a ton of work, but teachers are handling it well and we continue to work at the areas that could be improved.
- Hinkletown Mennonite School Pre-K in Ephrata PA
 - We transitioned a few students with extra social-emotional needs to kindergarten.
- Kraybill Mennonite School in Mount Joy PA
 - The school community benefits from our youngest members as it provides an opportunity for service for our older students, interacting, playing games, helping with recess,etc. Families who come for Pre-K often decide that a Kraybill education is right for their family.
 - A particular family who had no church affiliation was so happy with their early childhood experience that they enrolled their child in Kindergarten. It was great to see the way this family began to interact with others here.
- Parent and Preschool Center in Lancaster PA
 - Our annual BBQ fundraiser brough in the most money it ever has!
 - Able to assist families in need with tuition assistance.
- Salford Mennonite Child Care Centers in Harleysville PA
 - In March of 2020 we successfully continued to run one center instead of 2 after our consolidation year in 2019. After much trial and error, we created a positive working teaching teams along with a successful leadership team.
 - After reopening our doors during the Yellow phase of Pennsylvania's COVID-19 pandemic we had to adjust to a lot of new procedures and scheduling. Once again, the SMCCC team rose to the occasion showing their flexibility and teamwork to help our center survive. A lot is still unknown with COVID-19, but it is reassuring to know that we all have each other's well-being at heart. This is more than just a job.

Challenges were noted:

- Keep our PK students without contagious of Covid-19
- PK students attends to our facilities to take classes.
- COVID is of course the biggest challenge.
- EC enrollment is lower as families anticipated that schools would need to be remote-only. While we are open currently, parents in EC are more reluctant to bring their children onto campus than other grade levels.
- Lower enrollment has led to smaller staff numbers which has been an adjustment for those who are here. There is typically a larger group for collaboration, support, etc.
- Not being accredited we do not get as much financial help from organizations.
- Our space has been fairly limiting to class sizes.
- Re-doing, re-planning, re-thinking EVERYTHING because of Covid 19.
- •The past six months have been extremely challenging, time-consuming, and stressful. As director, I am behind in the office and do not see an end in the near future.
- We are still trying to figure out what virtual learning should look like for pre-k students.
- COVID-19: Helping children to follow appropriate protocols for health.
- Separation anxiety: possibly also from COVID. Students have more difficulty this year adjusting to being away from home and school routines.
- Drop in enrollment and implementing changes due to Covid.
- Filling open positions for the 2020/2021 school year.
- Our biggest challenge is remaining in business. As of this moment we are functioning with a lot less children and some teachers on PUA (pandemic unemployment assistance). Not being able to find children to enroll and not being able to pay teachers their full salaries has been very dangerous for SMCCC. We are grateful for the support of the Church and CARES act funding; however, it cannot last forever. Finding qualified and reliable teachers has always been a struggle and now things have gone from bad to worse.

- Managing COVID-19 during cold and flu season






PreK-12 Enrollment Trends

Ten-year PreK-12 Education Enrollment Trends by Institution, Based on Headcount









Racial/Ethnic Enrollment Changes, Fall 2013 through Fall 2020, PreK-12 Schools

Racial/Ethnic enrollment counts include all students from under-represented Racial/Ethnic groups, not just Mennonite Church USA. Only schools reporting this information are included in this table. The changes in the Racial/Ethnic student percentage of enrollment reflect variations in the schools that reported from year to year.

MSC schools as a whole have experienced an increase in the Racial/Ethnic population in spite of the general decrease in the number of MSC schools. However, another way to look at the data would be that in fall 2013, the average number of Racial/Ethnic students in each of the 32 reporting institutions was 81, and in 2020 the average number of Racial/Ethnic students in each of the 19 reporting institutions was 84.


- The undergraduate headcount decreased 42 students from 3,107 in fall 2019 to 3,065 in fall 2020, a decrease of 1.4%.
- The undergraduate full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment decreased by 8 FTE students (0.3%), from 3,008 in fall 2019 to 3,000 in fall 2020, compared with a decrease of 28 FTE students (0.9%) from 3,036 in fall 2018 to 3,008 in fall 2019.
- The undergraduate full-time enrollment increased by 10 students, from 2,946 in fall 2019 to 2,956 in fall 2020, an increase of 0.3%.
- The undergraduate part-time enrollment decreased by 52 students, from 161 in fall 2019 to 109 in fall 2020, a decrease of 32.3%.




• The undergraduate full-time Mennonite (Mennonite Church USA and other Mennonite groups) student enrollment decreased by 42 students (6.7%) from 623 in 2019 to 581 in 2020.


Current Year Undergraduate Racial/Ethnic Enrollment

- The total Racial/Ethnic undergraduate student population increased 84 students (10.3%) from 813 (26.2% of total enrollment) in 2019 to 897 (29.3% of total enrollment) in 2020. Increases in undergraduate Racial/Ethnic enrollments were experienced at four of the five higher education institutions from fall 2019 to fall 2020: Bethel (23), Bluffton (23), Goshen (21) and Hesston (3). The other institution had a decrease in undergraduate Racial/Ethnic enrollment, EMU (-5).
- Of the total 897 Racial/Ethnic undergraduate population enrolled in fall 2020, 78 students (8.7%) were Mennonite, and 819 students (91.3%) were non-Mennonite. This compares to 2019 in which the total Racial/Ethnic undergraduate population was 813—7 students (9.5%) were Mennonite, and 736 students (90.5%) were non-Mennonite.
- The total number of Mennonite undergraduate Racial/Ethnic students increased slightly from 77 (2.3% of total enrollment) in 2019 to 78 (2.3% of total enrollment) in 2020. The total number of non-Mennonite Racial/Ethnic students increased by 83 students to 819 (24.2% of total enrollment) from 2018 to 2019.





































































Total System Enrollment Changes

- The 10-year total undergraduate Racial/Ethnic headcount increased 47.5%—from 608 (16.4%) students in fall 2011 to 897 (29.3%) students in fall 2020, an increase of 293 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate African American headcount increased 19.6%—from 225 (6.1%) students in fall 2011 to 269 (7.9%) students in fall 2020, an increase of 44students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Asian/Pacific Islander headcount increased 27.5%—from 51 (1.4%) students in fall 2011 to 65 (1.9%) students in fall 2020, an increase of 14 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Hispanic headcount increased 102.4%—from 205 (5.5%) students in fall 2011 to 415 (12.2%) students in fall 2020, an increase of 210 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Native American headcount increased 154.6%—from 11 (0.3%) students in fall 2011 to 28 (0.8%) students in fall 2020, an increase of 17 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Other Racial/Ethnic headcount increased 3.5%—from 116 (3.2%) students in fall 2011 to 120 (3.6%) students in fall 2020, an increase of 4 students.

Mennonite Racial/Ethnic Enrollment Changes

- In 2020, the total undergraduate Mennonite Racial/Ethnic student headcount increased 1.3% —from 77 (2.3%) in 2019 to 78 (2.3%) in 2020.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Mennonite Racial/Ethnic headcount decreased 24.3%—from 103 (2.8%) students in fall 2011 to 78 (2.3%) students in fall 2020, a decrease of 25 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Mennonite African American student headcount decreased 42.1%—from 19 (0.5%) students in fall 2011 to 11 (0.3%) students in fall 2020, a decrease of 8 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Mennonite Asian/Pacific Islander student headcount increased 17.7%—from 17 (0.5%) students in fall 2011 to 20 (0.6%) students in fall 2020, an increase of 3 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Mennonite Hispanic student headcount decreased 24.3%—from 37 (1.0%) students in fall 2011 to 28 (0.8%) students in fall 2020, a decrease of 9 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Mennonite Native American student headcount decreased 83.3% from 2 (0.1%) students in fall 2011 to 0 (0.0%) students in fall 2020. It continues to be a challenge to attract Native American students to our campuses.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Mennonite Other Racial/Ethnic student headcount decreased 32.1%—from 28 (0.8%) students in fall 2011 to 19 (0.6%) students in fall 2020, a decrease of 9 students.







- In 2020, international students (183) made up 5.4% of undergraduate enrollment. Sixteen students (0.5% of the total headcount population) were Mennonite, and 167 students (4.9% of the total headcount population) were non-Mennonite.
- The undergraduate international student population increased 7.0% from 171 students in 2014 to 183 students in 2020, that is, from providing 4.9% of the total student population in 2014 to 5.4% of the population in 2020.
- The cross-cultural impact on the undergraduate programs of the Mennonite colleges and universities can be calculated by adding the total (headcount) Racial/Ethnic and international student populations together. Thus, 897 Racial/Ethnic students and 183 international students, create a cross-cultural impact on the total undergraduate programs of 1080 students (35.2% based on headcount) in 2020. This compares to a total of 813 Racial/Ethnic students and 191 international students in 2019 for a cross-cultural impact of 1004 students (32.3% based on headcount) representing an increase of 76 students (7.6%) from 2019 to 2020. Since 2011, the total cross-cultural impact of Racial/Ethnic and international students has increased by 319 students (41.9%) from 761 students to 1,080 students in 2020.
















Adult Degree-Completion Mennonite Trends


Bluffton, EMU and Goshen offer graduate level programs. The combined graduate enrollment headcount increased 26.9% from 447 students in fall 2019 to 567 students in fall 2020. Enrollments may fluctuate significantly from year to year due to the nature and timing of courses and programs offered for professional development. In fall 2020 two institutions reported an increase in graduate program enrollments: Bluffton increased 1.7% (1 students) from 58 in 2019 to 59 students in 2020. EMU increased 41.6% (128 students) from 308 in 2019 to 436 students in 2020. Goshen decreased 11.1% (9 students) from 81 in 2019 to 72 students in 2020.



HIGHER EDUCATION: Seminary

Current Year

- The seminary enrollment headcount for Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary (AMBS) and Eastern Mennonite Seminary (EMS) increased 18.8%, from 160 in fall 2019 to 190 in fall 2020, An increase of 30 students AMBS increased by 40 (45.5%) and EMS decreased by 10 (13.9%).
- The seminary full-time enrollment decreased 1.9% from 54 in fall 2019 to 53 in fall 2020, a decrease of 1 student AMBS increased by 1 (3.1%) and EMS decreased by 2 (9.1%).
- The seminary part-time enrollment increased 29.2%, from 106 in fall 2019 to 137 in fall 2020, an increase of 31 students AMBS increased by 39 (69.6%) and EMS decreased by 8 (16.0%).
- The seminary full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment increased 2.2%, from 90 FTE in fall 2019 to 92 FTE in fall 2020, an increase of 2 FTE AMBS increased by 5 (10.0%) and EMS decreased by 3 (7.5%).








Seminary Full-time Mennonite Enrollment Eight-year Trend, Composite and by Institution





The mission of Instituto Biblico Anabautista (IBA) is to provide educational resources that promote biblical- theological training of Spanish-speaking leaders who will serve Mennonite Church USA in various ministries. IBA functions under Mennonite Education Agency (MEA) in partnership with Mennonite Mission Network and Iglesia Menonita Hispana. IBA is a biblical and theological education program for ministerial preparation. It was founded in 1988 to fulfill the vision of the Reference Council of the Hispanic Ministries Department of the former General Conference Mennonite Church.

The institute functions by study centers in the local congregations with a tutor assigned to each center. Most of the students take an active part in the leadership of their congregations, such as serving as Sunday school teachers or deacons, while others have been chosen as pastors and/or church planters.

For the year 2019-2020, IBA had:

- A total of 200 students in 26 centers
- 26 centers in 10 states, and one in Mexico
- An average of 7.7 students per center
- Two new centers established—One in Iowa, and one in Florida
- A total of 33 volunteer tutors, including 13 coordinators
- 11 different courses taught, and one workshops








Comparison of Mennonite College/University Attendance Reporting with Youth Census Reporting of Higher Education Enrollment by Congregations

College/university attendance information is requested on the Youth Census data collection form. Some persons submitting census information have good data available to them and some do not, so the consistency of this information varies.

However, a comparison of the reports regarding Mennonite college/university attendance was included in Table 16 even though the long-term value of this report may be in question.

This model is flawed because it assumes that the college/university students included in a specific enrollment year all came directly from high school to higher education. The reality is that college/university students often take time out for service, work or travel rather than follow a four-year lock-step sequence to enrollment in a college/university. However, the model begins to lay the foundation for tightening the collection of data around this question.
