OVERVIEW OF ENROLLMENT REPORTS

Enrollment numbers are one of many ways to look at our Mennonite educational institutions and programs. It is the intent of this report to offer a glimpse into Mennonite education by focusing on one area: enrollment. For those who are interested in more in-depth analysis or more information on a specific area, please contact the MEA office at info@mennoniteeducation.org.

MEA has gathered enrollment statistics from the various education levels and educational programs for many years. Enrollment statistics at the PreK-12 level include only the member schools of Mennonite Schools Council (MSC). Please note that two international schools are affiliated members of MSC— Colegio Americas Unidas in Colombia and Lezha Academic Center in Albania. Other Mennonite PreK-12 schools and early childhood education centers scattered across North America that are not MSC members are not included in these reports. Preschool enrollment data was also collected from Mennonite Early Childhood Network members.

The enrollment data is presented using the following levels and/or categories:

Preschool programs of Mennonite Early Childhood Network (MECN)

Prekindergarten, elementary, middle, and secondary programs of Mennonite Schools Council (MSC) schools

Undergraduate programs of Bethel College, Bluffton University, Eastern Mennonite University (EMU), Goshen College and Hesston College

Adult degree-completion programs of Bluffton University, EMU and Goshen College

Graduate programs of Bluffton University, EMU and Goshen College

Seminary programs of Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary (AMBS) and Eastern Mennonite Seminary (EMS)

Other degree program of Seminario Bíblico Anabautista Hispano (SeBAH)

Non-degree program of Instituto Bíblico Anabautista (IBA)

Under each level are current year statistics and basic enrollment trend charts or tables. We have chosen to further break down the enrollment data by focusing on Mennonite enrollment data (both Mennonite Church USA and other Mennonite groups) and Racial/Ethnic enrollment data (including both U.S. Racial/Ethnic and international students).

As you look at the numbers and reach your own conclusions, here are some helpful definitions:

Full-time – students taking the number of credit hours required by the institution to receive full-time status

Part-time - students taking fewer credit hours than the minimum needed for full-time status

FTE – full-time equivalent (adding the credit hours of both full-time and part-time students to determine the possible number of full-time students)

Head count - total number of students regardless of their part-time or full-time status

Racial/Ethnic – refers to students from under-represented Racial/Ethnic groups from the United States; in the higher education institutions the Racial/Ethnic count refers only to Racial/Ethnic students from the U.S., international students are a separate category

International - students at U.S. schools from countries other than the United States, and students at Canadian schools from countries other than Canada

A significant effort was made to ensure that our enrollment reports have integrity and that the findings accurately reflect the numbers. The enrollment numbers of an entire educational system can bury implications deep below the obvious surface interpretations. Care needs to be taken that assumptions are not made using only one small part of the data without putting such data elements into the context of the larger system. In an educational system as small as MEA's, a few unique circumstances can skew the findings of an entire segment of the report. These unique situations have been identified, when possible, throughout the report and have been taken into consideration in our analysis of the information. Tension between system wide trends and local realities is acknowledged. It is also important to note that these numbers are a picture of what enrollment looks like on a *particular* day at a *particular* institution.

The transformation that birthed MEA and merged multiple educational systems also disrupted the longstanding data collection procedures. The most reliable and consistent data enables eight-year to 14-year trend reports. Enrollment numbers from one year provide a very short insight into enrollment patterns, but they are not very helpful for long-range planning. Whenever possible, longer trends are provided. Great care has gone into the accuracy of the numbers reported.

The interpretation of the numbers can be viewed from several perspectives—usually shaped by the question or the person reading the data. For the purpose of this report, the focus was determined by the MEA outcome statement focused on "ready and viable access" as stated below:

Viable Access. Students seeking Christ-centered Anabaptist-Mennonite education have viable access to Mennonite Church USA schools.

Working with the schools on issues related to location, delivery system, cost, transfer and outreach to the under-served, MEA envisions and supports programs and initiatives that facilitate ready accessibility.

TOTAL SYSTEM HIGHLIGHTS

Current Year Systemwide Enrollment

Mennonite educational institutions are touching the lives of 9,290 students (based on headcount) in fall 2022, an increase of 189 (2.1%) students from the 2021 total of 9,101. In higher education, the total headcount decreased by 71 students (with decreases of 72 in adult degree-completion, 78 in undergraduate, and increases of 71 in graduate and 8 in seminary). Preschool, elementary, and secondary education levels showed an increase of 260 (5.0%). All higher education institutions reported their enrollment numbers. For the academic year 2022-2023, there are 24 MSC schools (22-member schools and two affiliates), and MEA received data from 18 of them. For the previous academic year, data was received from 17 MSC schools.


Headcount information from Mennonite Early Childhood Network (MECN) preschool/childcare centers (non-MSC schools) is included. For the academic year 2022-2023 MEA received data from three preschool/childcare centers that was not part of an MSC school. The data varies from year to year depending on which preschool centers report information.

Current Year Systemwide Mennonite Enrollment


"Mennonite Church USA" students include only those that report attending a Mennonite Church USA congregation. All other Mennonites are included in the "All Mennonite" category. Note that the number of Mennonite Church USA students in higher education in fall 2022 (402) decreased from the 2021 total (471) for a combined decrease of 69 while PreK-12 increased 181 for a total net increase of 112 in fall 2022.




Multi-year Mennonite Full-time Students as Percentage of Total Enrollment, 2017-2022




In 2022, Mennonite Church USA students comprise 12.8% of the total full-time enrollment at all levels, and full-time all Mennonites account for 23.7% of the total full-time enrollment. The systemwide full-time Mennonite Church USA and other Mennonite student enrollment increased 676 students (50.9%) from 1,859 in Fall 2021 to 2,005 in Fall 2022. Full-time enrollment data from Fall 20 17 to 2022 are included for comparative purposes. The Mennonite student population for the total enrollment breaks out as follows:

You may note that the total number of all Mennonites attending higher education institutions decreased from 858 to 597 (30.4%) from 2017 to 2022. All areas of higher education except Graduate experienced a decrease (Undergraduate from 773 to 502—35.1%, Adult degree-completion from 13 to 9—30.8%, and Seminary from 45 to 28—37.8%) during the same period. Graduate education showed an increased (Graduate from 27 to 58—114.8%). In this section, the PreK numbers from MECN institutions or programs that are not part of MSC schools are not included because the number of Mennonite/non-Mennonite students is not available.







PRESCHOOL PROGRAMS Mennonite Early Childhood Network

The Mennonite Early Childhood Network (MECN) was established in 2005 to address the care and education of children, birth through kindergarten, in through-the-week programs. The mission of MECN, is to assist in developing the whole child spiritually, physically, emotionally, socially and cognitively with a framework that reflects an Anabaptist interpretation* of the Christian faith by providing information and resources for parents and early educators of all children, birth through kindergarten. (*Christ is the center of our faith, Community is the center of our life, Reconciliation is the center of our work)

MECN provides resources for nurturing young children, including the website *Building Faith* at http://buildingfaithmecn.weebly.com/ written by Mennonite parents of young children to provide Anabaptist-based resources for those who raise and teach young children. The MECN website includes resources for early childhood education (www.MennoniteEducation.org), encourages networking opportunities among its members, and represents Mennonite early childhood education at Mennonite conferences.

MECN Survey Results - Fall 2022

Eleven early childhood programs responded to the Mennonite Early Childhood data survey. Eight of these are Mennonite Schools Council members. Three are independent centers housed in a Mennonite churches.

The programs represented were:

- preschool as part of a school program
- preschool (separate from a school program)

Seven schools reported having a state license plus regional accreditation or participation in a quality rating system like the STARS rating, accreditation by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), or accreditation by a regional body.

Mennonite early childhood centers serve a diverse mix of families. This includes Mennonite and related Anabaptist families, families from other denominations, and families with no faith affiliation. The reporting early childhood centers reported that they serve 17.1% Mennonite families, 82.9% other-than-Mennonite, and 49.2% ethnic diversity but are 50.8% Caucasian. Centers reported having 11.4% children with exceptionalities/special needs.

The early childhood centers represented in this report were started out of parent, family, community, church and school initiatives in each decade since the 1970s.

Program highlights that were shared include the following:

- Diamond Street Early Childhood Center in Akron PA
 - We have added an additional classroom for school age before and after care.
 - We have added Simple IRAs as a staff benefit.
- Dock Mennonite Academy in Souderton PA
 - The community building events are again being scheduled and families are thrilled to be back in the schools again.
 - As we looked to fill some teaching positions this year, we were really blessed with the number of applicants. We were able to hire a number of well-educated gifted teachers with a strong faith.
- Growing Tree Preschool in Chambersburg PA
 - We have welcomed a new director.
 - Staff turnover was very low. I only had one teacher not return! Staff morale was good.
- Hinkletown Mennonite School Pre-K in Ephrata PA
 - We have a dynamic PreK teacher who has a passion for Christian education and helping the students succeed academically.
 - We feel the support of our parents by their prayers, volunteering time and sharing financial resources with the school and PreK class.
- Kraybill Mennonite School in Mount Joy PA
 - The school community benefits from our youngest members as it provides an opportunity for service for our older students, interacting, playing games, helping with recess, etc. Families who come for Pre-K often decide that a Kraybill education is right for their family.
 - Parents expressing thankfulness for the Christian, quality, and affordable full-day daily care for their children.
- Little Blessings Daycare & Learning Center in Freeman SD
 - Director finished director certification with State of SD. Employees taking training in best practices.
 - We are currently up to full capacity due to the challenges of finding enough staff.
- Parent and Preschool Center in Lancaster PA
 - We raised the most we have ever raised at our Chicken BBQ fundraiser this year. This puts us in a great spot for our fundraising goals for the year.
 - We rewrote progress reports for all our classes. The teachers worked together and referenced the PA Early Learning Standards as well as examples from other early childhood centers to update our reports.
- Roberta Webb Early Education Center in Harrisonburg VA
 - We have two classes fully enrolled after two years of reduced enrollment due to COVID.
 - RWEEC obtained silver level "Living Wage Certification" through the Harrisonburg-Rockingham Living Wage Certification Program.
- Salford Mennonite Child Care Centers in Harleysville PA
 - One highlight of this year was purchasing and then implementing a new communication app with families.
 - Another highlight of this past year is the PA stabilization grant. This grant helped support teachers financially as it helps build them professionally.
- Western Christian School in Salem OR
 - We have 2 new classrooms and a playground for the students to use.
- Yellow Creek Daycare and Preschool in Goshen IN
 - Large graduating preschool class.
 - Minimum covid cases-daycare remained open.

Challenges were noted:

- Low enrolment
- Each year we are seeing more students that come to our school with struggles with boundaries and sensory processing.
- Finding qualified teachers remains to be one of our biggest challenges.
- The other big challenge is salaries. With the growing amount of expenses our staff face, along with the rest of the world, we find it hard to pay teachers what they deserve.
- Staffing shortages and hiring of qualified, invested staff. There is a lack of interest in the early education field in general.
- Federal and state regulations that are inconsistent with the professional standard to enter the early education field.
- Enrollment is down this year in our PreK 4/5 3 Full Day class. This is the class that brings in the most tuition for our center. Having less kids has affected our budget and we will need to be careful with our spending this year.
- Meeting the needs of all children and families in the unique ways that they need to be cared for and educated.
- The biggest challenge we have now is hiring help. We have been trying to find help but have only been partially.
- The next challenge is to keep full time staff at 40 hrs. a week. Staff are working on average 3-6 hours OT a week.
- Challenges with students who are identified as needing additional support from other agencies, such as the Intermediate Unit, but receiving the services for the students takes time.
- Discernment regarding requests from families to provide additional care for students younger than 4 yrs.
- With growing enrollment, space is one of the most pressing challenges we face.
- We are noticing may developmental delays that may have come from pandemic restrictions. We are seeing speech, motor, and academic delays.
- We are also seeing more anxiety in our preschool children.
- One challenge is trying to figure out how to return to "normal." Is returning the way to go or has Covid provided us with an opportunity to rethink how things were run in the past?
- With the restrictions removed, everyone is relearning how to be together and share spaces. What does personal space mean? How do we communicate not only verbally but with facial expressions. After wearing masks for so long, now students are see facial expressions and trying to interpret what they mean. Are we reading too much into facial expressions?
- We are perpetually short staffed.

Mennonite Early Childhood Network Enrollments, by Age/Grade Level, Fall 2022-23 Mennonite Education Agency



PreK-12 Current Year Enrollment

Total PreK-12 enrollments increased 127 students (5.9%) from 5,041 in fall 2021 to 5,337 in fall 2022. For the academic year 2022-23, there are 24 MSC member schools (including two affiliates), and MEA received data from 18 of them. For the previous academic year, data was received from 17 MSC member schools.




PreK-12 Enrollment Trends

Ten-year PreK-12 Education Enrollment Trends by Institution, Based on Headcount









Racial/Ethnic Enrollment Changes, Fall 2015 through Fall 2022, PreK-12 Schools

Racial/Ethnic enrollment counts include all students from under-represented Racial/Ethnic groups, not just Mennonite Church USA. Only schools reporting this information are included in this table. The changes in the Racial/Ethnic student percentage of enrollment reflect variations in the schools that reported from year to year.

MSC schools have experienced a decrease in the Racial/Ethnic population. Another way to look at the data would be that in fall 2015, the average number of Racial/Ethnic students in each of the 21 reporting institutions was 85, and in 2022 the average number of Racial/Ethnic students in each of the 17 reporting institutions was 78.


- The undergraduate headcount decreased 71 students from 3,091 in fall 2021 to 3,020 in fall 2022, a decrease of 2.3%.
- The undergraduate full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment decreased by 83 FTE students (2.8%), from 2,991 in fall 2021 to 2,908 in fall 2022, compared with a decrease of 9 FTE students (0.3%) from 3,008 in fall 2020 to 2,991 in fall 2021.
- The undergraduate full-time enrollment decreased by 92 students, from 2,947 in fall 2021 to 2,855 in fall 2022, a decrease of 3.1%.
- The undergraduate part-time enrollment increased by 21 students, from 144 in fall 2021 to 165 in fall 2022, an increase of 14.6%.


Current Year Undergraduate Mennonite Enrollment


• The undergraduate full-time Mennonite (Mennonite Church USA and other Mennonite groups) student enrollment decreased by 71 students (12.4%) from 573 in 2021 to 502 in 2022.


Current Year Undergraduate Racial/Ethnic Enrollment

- The total Racial/Ethnic undergraduate student population increased 20 students (2.2%) from 896 (29.7% of total enrollment) in 2021 to 916 (30.3% of total enrollment) in 2022. Increases in undergraduate Racial/Ethnic enrollments were experienced at two of the five higher education institutions from fall 2021 to fall 2022: Bethel (44) and EMU (27). The other institutions had a decrease in undergraduate Racial/Ethnic enrollment, Bluffton (19), Goshen (26), and Hesston (7).
- Of the total 916 Racial/Ethnic undergraduate population enrolled in fall 2022, 69 students (2.3%) were Mennonite, and 847 students (28.0%) were non-Mennonite. This compares to 2021 in which the total Racial/Ethnic undergraduate population was 896—84 students (2.8%) were Mennonite, and 812 students (26.9%) were non-Mennonite.
- The total number of Mennonite undergraduate Racial/Ethnic students decreased from 84 (2.8% of total enrollment) in 2021 to 69 (2.3% of total enrollment) in 2022. The total number of non-Mennonite Racial/Ethnic students increased by 35 students to 847 (28.0% of total enrollment) for that same period.






















































Total System Enrollment Changes

- The 10-year total undergraduate Racial/Ethnic headcount increased 48.2%—from 618 (17.3%) students in fall 2013 to 916 (30.3%) students in fall 2022, an increase of 298 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate African American headcount increased 42.9%—from 226 (6.4%) students in fall 2013 to 323 (10.7%) students in fall 2022, an increase of 97 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Asian/Pacific Islander headcount increased 60.0%—from 35 (1.0%) students in fall 2013 to 56 (1.9%) students in fall 2022, an increase of 21 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Hispanic headcount increased 78.2%—from 239 (7.5%) students in fall 2013 to 426 (14.1%) students in fall 2022, an increase of 187 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Native American headcount increased 285.7%—from 7 (0.2%) students in fall 2013 to 27 (0.9%) students in fall 2022, an increase of 20 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Other Racial/Ethnic headcount increased 3.7%—from 81 (2.2%) students in fall 2013 to 84 (2.8%) students in fall 2022, an increase of 3 students.

- In 2022, the total undergraduate Mennonite Racial/Ethnic student headcount decreased 17.9% from 84 (2.7%) in 2021 to 69 (2.3%) in 2022.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Mennonite Racial/Ethnic headcount decreased 18.8%—from 85 (2.4%) students in fall 2013 to 69 (2.3%) students in fall 2022, a decrease of 16 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Mennonite African American student headcount decreased 50.0%—from 20 (0.6%) students in fall 2013 to 10 (0.3%) students in fall 2022, a decrease of 10 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Mennonite Asian/Pacific Islander student headcount increased 50.0%—from 10 (0.3%) students in fall 2013 to 15 (0.5%) students in fall 2022, an increase of 5 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Mennonite Hispanic student headcount decreased 6.1%—from 33 (0.9%) students in fall 2013 to 31 (1.0%) students in fall 2022, a decrease of 2 students.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Mennonite Native American student headcount decreased 100.0% from 3 (0.1%) students in fall 2013 to 0 (0.0%) students in fall 2022. It continues to be a challenge to attract Native American students to our campuses.
- The 10-year total undergraduate Mennonite Other Racial/Ethnic student headcount decreased 31.6%—from 19 (0.5%) students in fall 2013 to 13 (0.4%) students in fall 2022, a decrease of 6 students.







- In 2022, international students (225) made up 7.5% of undergraduate enrollment. Eighteen students (0.6% of the total headcount population) were Mennonite, and 207 students (6.9% of the total headcount population) were non-Mennonite.
- The undergraduate international student population increased 42.4% from 158 students in 2016 to 225 students in 2022, that is, from providing 4.8% of the total student population in 2016 to 7.5% of the population in 2022.
- The cross-cultural impact on the undergraduate programs of the Mennonite colleges and universities can be calculated by adding the total (headcount) Racial/Ethnic and international student populations together. Thus, 916 Racial/Ethnic students and 225 international students, create a cross-cultural impact on the total undergraduate programs of 1,141 students (37.8% based on headcount) in 2022. This compares to a total of 896 Racial/Ethnic students and 214 international students in 2021 for a cross-cultural impact of 1,110 students (35.9% based on headcount) representing an increase of 31 students (2.8%) from 2021 to 2022. Since 2013, the total cross-cultural impact of Racial/Ethnic and international students has increased by 339 students (42.3%) from 802 students to 1,141 students in 2022.











Adult Degree-Completion Enrollment Trends






Adult Degree-Completion Mennonite Trends


Bluffton, EMU and Goshen offer graduate level programs. The combined graduate enrollment headcount increased 15.5% from 459 students in fall 2021 to 530 students in fall 2022. Enrollments may fluctuate significantly from year to year due to the nature and timing of courses and programs offered for professional development. In fall 2022 two institutions reported an increase in graduate program enrollments: Bluffton increased 28.6% (418 students) from 63 in 2021 to 81 students in 2022. EMU increased 19.2% (64 students) from 334 in 2021 to 398 students in 2022. Goshen decreased 17.7% (11 students) from 62 in 2021 to 51 students in 2022.



HIGHER EDUCATION: Seminary

Current Year

- The seminary enrollment headcount for Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary (AMBS) and Eastern Mennonite Seminary (EMS) increased 4.5%, from 177 in fall 2021 to 185 in fall 2022, An increase of 8 students AMBS increased by 14 (11.0%) and EMS decreased by 6 (12.0%).
- The seminary full-time enrollment decreased 4.9% from 41 in fall 2021 to 39 in fall 2022, a decrease of 2 students AMBS decreased by 5 (17.2%) and EMS increased by 3 (25.0%).
- The seminary part-time enrollment increased 7.4%, from 136 in fall 2021 to 146 in fall 2022, a decrease of 10 student AMBS increased by 19 (19.4%) and EMS decreased by 9 (23.7%).
- The seminary full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment decreased 7.2%, from 83 FTE in fall 2021 to 77 FTE in fall 2022, a decrease of 6 FTE AMBS decreased by 5 (8.8%) and EMS decreased by 1 (3.8%).










Seminary Full-time Mennonite Enrollment Eight-year Trend, Composite and by Institution



The mission of Instituto Bíblico Anabautista (IBA) is to provide educational resources that promote biblical theological training of Spanish-speaking leaders who will serve Mennonite Church USA in various ministries. IBA functions under Mennonite Education Agency (MEA) in partnership with Mennonite Mission Network and Iglesia Menonita Hispana. IBA is a biblical and theological education program for ministerial preparation. It was founded in 1988 to fulfill the vision of the Reference Council of the Hispanic Ministries Department of the former General Conference Mennonite Church.

The institute functions by study centers in the local congregations with a tutor assigned to each center. Most of the students take an active part in the leadership of their congregations, such as serving as Sunday school teachers or deacons, while others have been chosen as pastors and/or church planters.

For the year 2021-2022, IBA had:

- A total of 166 students in 23 centers
- 23 centers in 10 states
- An average of 7.2 students per center
- A total of 23 volunteer tutors and coordinators
- 11 different courses taught, and two workshops





